Equity Strategies in Transportation

Area Agency on Aging Programs

- Local Paratransit broker provides direct services and subcontracts with community-based organizations (Title IIIB)
- Our funding facilitates transport to activity centers and to grocery stores
- We also fund a small amount of taxi vouchers for people with disabilities





Partnerships across systems

San Francisco Municipal Transportation Authority

Consider opportunities to co-locate

Advocacy to advance equitable policies

Public transportation advocacy

- Passed in 2015 following many years of community advocacy and organizing
- Extends free bus and light rail access to seniors and people with disabilities with income below AMI
- 38,000 applications processed in the first month





Highlight diverse and sometimes diverging needs in citywide projects

Public transportation advocacy

- Projects to improve public transit can inadvertently focus on majority at expense of the minority
- Community organizations and stakeholders can have powerful voice
- Role for Area Agency on Aging as liaison and subject matter expert
- Opportunities within Age-Friendly Cities





Identify and address access **barriers**Public spaces and projects

- Be part of the ongoing dialogue
- Support efforts to balance needs and desires of diverse populations without creating access barriers
