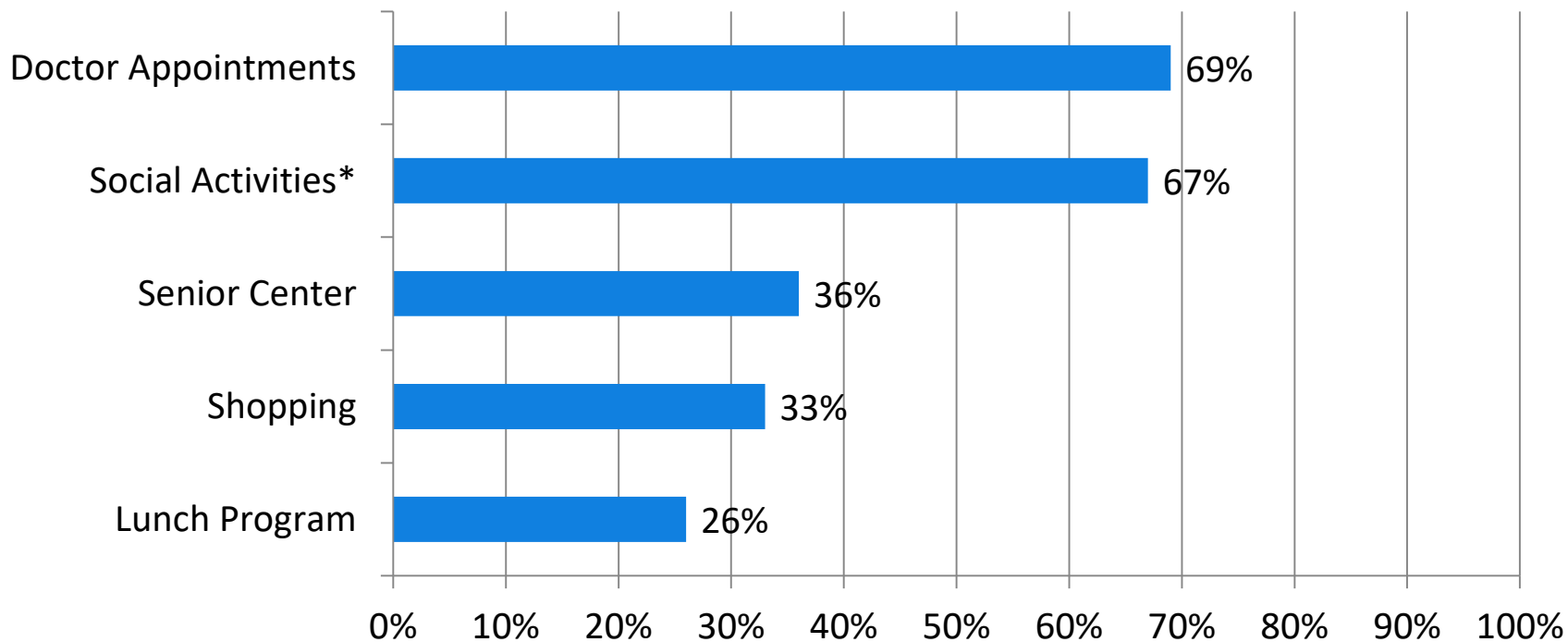

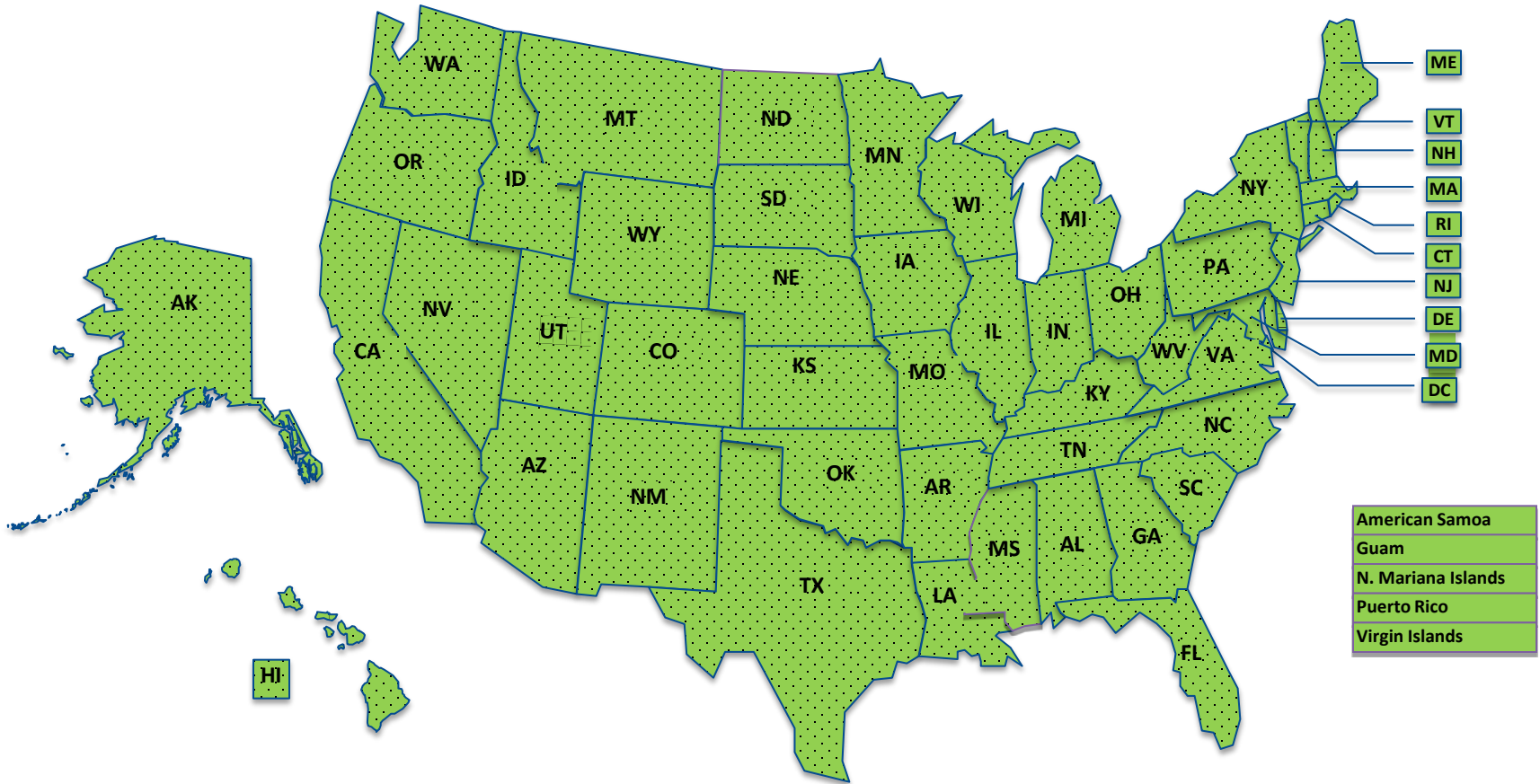
Percentage of Title III Transportation Users Using Services to Reach Each Destination, 2015

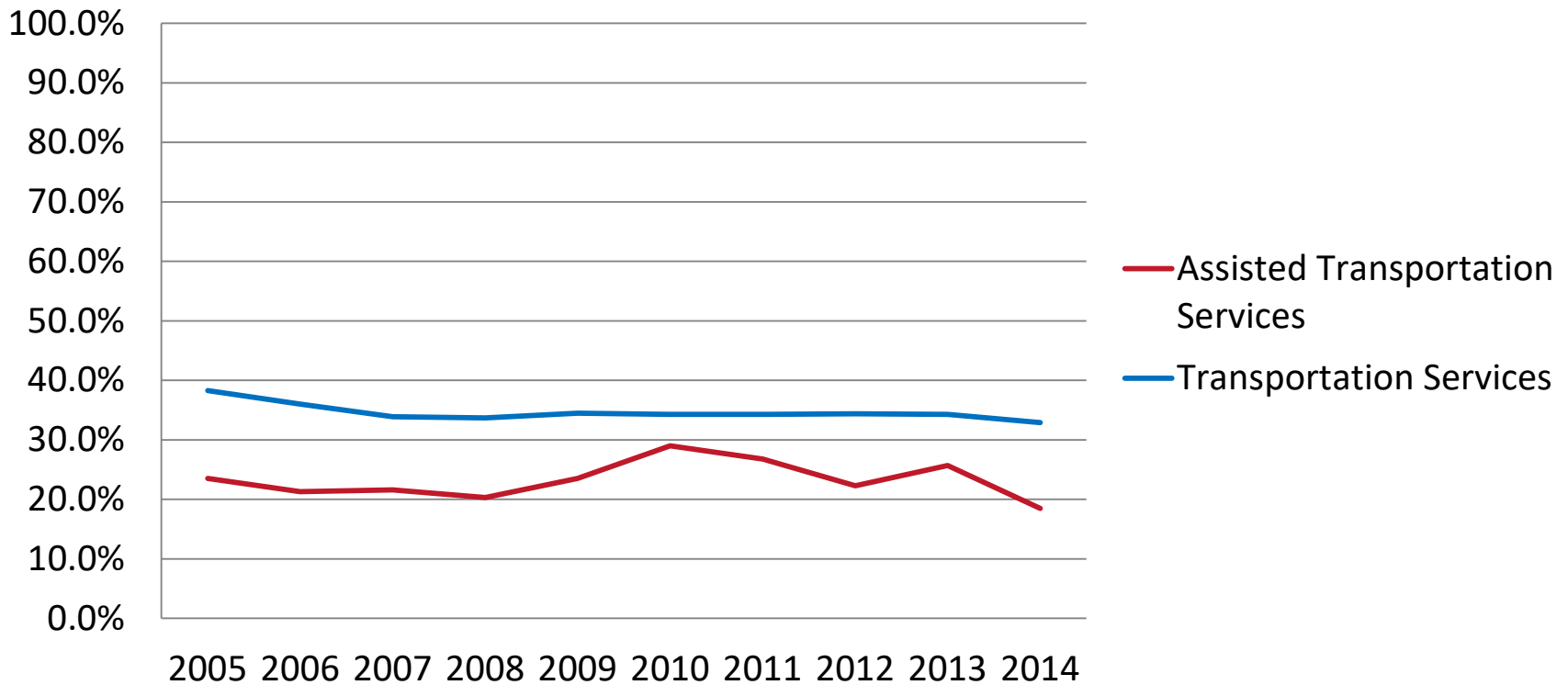

- Title VI Transportation (Supportive Services to older Tribal members) – 816,949 rides

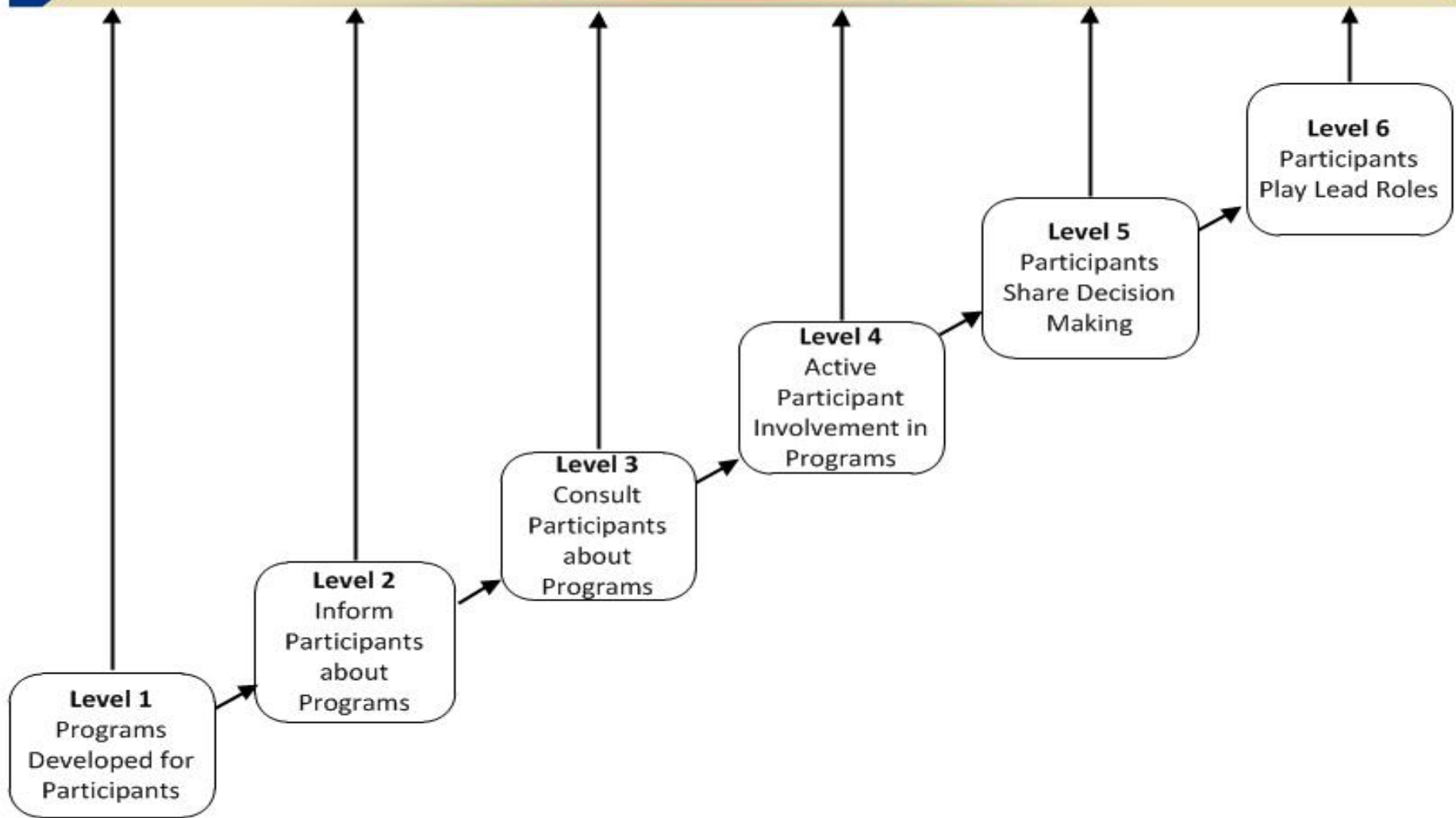
