

#### Lessons learned

- Some people can use existing transit options, but don't know how to navigate transit systems
- Other people need transportation services that aren't available from current transit options, such as door-todoor service, longer travel
- Social isolation isn't unusual for people in rural communities, but they would still appreciate and benefit from more social connections

### IMPLEMENTATION PROPOSAL

- Volunteer Driver Program
  - Fill gaps between existing transit options
  - Connect rural communities and individuals with city-center services
- Technical and transit training
  - Help seniors and disabled adults use technology to connect, and to access transit options
  - Work with transit providers to bring hands-on experience using current transit options
- Create transit hub website + brochures
